Please note. All competition stops at 12:00pm for Pipers to assemble for the lunch time Mass Band, and Official Opening Ceremony, We would appreciate participation from all pipers.

Competition recommences at 1.00pm

**TERMS AND CONDITIONS:** This Competition is not conducted under the rules of the Piping & Dancing Assn of NZ. Membership Certificates are not a requirement to compete in this competition.

The Adult grade is limited to competitors 20 years of age or older. The pipers playing ability must be C Grade or below. If you are an adult learner and have already competed or are currently competing in any B Grade level or equivalent grades you are ineligible to compete in the Adult Learner events.

Competitors **MUST** report to the steward 5 mins before each event. Tuning on the board will be strictly limited to 1 1/2 minutes.

Points are allocated per event to determine placing for that event.

Events are as followed.

1. Slow Air
2. 6/8 March
3. 2/4 March
4. Strathspey & Reel
5. Hornpipe and Jig
6. Piobaireachd

\*\*\* After the 2/4 March the competitor the piper can step off the board for re tuning (if required). Then with the nod from the Judge step back on the board to play the S R if applicable. \*\*\*

\*\*\* After the Slow Air the competitor the piper can step off the board for re tuning (if required). Then with the nod from the Judge step back on the board to plat the 6/8 March if applicable. \*\*\*

## **Tuning**

Competitors can have support to tune. Tuning for Event 1& 2 and Event 3&4. If help is required to tune between theses tunes the support person must be near the board to provide help. The competitor can not leave the area to find help.

## **Overall Winner**

Points will be added together from all events that the competitor competed in.

Maximum of 5 events combined points. If a piper plays in all 6 events the highest points from only 5 events will be combined

The Judges decision is final.

All events: Prizes Awarded on participant numbers.

3 entries - 1st Prize only awarded.

5 entries - 1st and 2nd Prizes awarded.

7 or more entries – 1st, 2nd and 3rd Prizes awarded.
